

Structuring Street Segments


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A street segment is defined first by the street's name, and then by the beginning location of the segment, followed by the end location. Below are some examples.

For streets that run north to south the beginning location is the southern most public road. The end location is the northern most public road.



For streets that run east to west the beginning location is the western most public road. The end location is the eastern most public road.



If a street's beginning or end location is a Dead End (End Section) or Cul-de-sac or if the street is a looped street the street segments would be named as shown below.
