- WHEREAS, the City of Vancouver renews its commitment to protecting the tribal sovereignty and selfdetermination of Native American peoples; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Vancouver is committed to engaging in dialogues, led by tribal communities, around the opportunities and work in which they are currently engaged in the areas of self-determination, sovereignty, and cultural preservation, to create an active government-to-government collaboration; and
- WHEREAS during the month of November, we honor our native peoples in this, their ancestral homes, and recognize their continued contributions in strengthening the diversity of our society.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Anne McEnerny-Ogle, Mayor of Vancouver, Washington, do hereby proclaim the November 2024 as:

"Native American Cultural Heritage Month"

And November 29, 2024, as:

"Native American Heritage Day"

and encourage all community members to join in this observance.
