- WHEREAS, This celebration displays the city's commitment to support all community members and its ongoing work toward becoming a a safe place for LGBTQ2S+ people with expanded protections for all, and
- "Saturday in the Park Pride Event" is a positive, open, family-focused, inclusive lesbian, WHEREAS, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, and Two Spirt community event; and
- WHEREAS, the LGBTQ2S+ community continues to be a target of violence, harassment, and discrimination by many and yet continue to thrive through the support of LGBTQ2S+ affirming spaces, agencies, and individual allies, and
- "Saturday in the Park Pride Event" creates a safe, visible, and affirming festival to WHEREAS. promote communication and dialogue between the LGBTQ2S+ people and their families with the entire community; and
- "Saturday in the Park Pride Event" celebrates all of Vancouver's diverse communities in WHEREAS. an expression of unity, discriminating against none, and promoting a healthy inclusive environment for the entire community of the Greater Vancouver Area.
