


Comprehensive Plan

Plan for managing growth and development, investing in infrastructure and protecting the natural environment over the next 20 years.

- Significant existing policy guidance:
 - 2024-2044 Transportation System Plan
 - 2023-2029 Strategic Plan
 - 2023 Housing Action Plan
 - 2023 Urban Forestry Management Plan
 - 2022-2031 Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services Comprehensive Plan
 - 2022-2040 Climate Action Framework and associated Adaptation Strategy
 - 2019 Reside Vancouver Anti-Displacement Plan
- Two Comprehensive Plan Elements where detailed policy direction missing: Economic Opportunity, Equity & Inclusion

Purpose


- Provide a roadmap for future equitable development projects
- Outline policies, programs and actions that will lead to more equitable built environment outcomes
- Provides resource for all City departments to integrate equity into decision-making and investments
- Provides policy and implementation direction for the Equity Chapter of the Comprehensive Plan

Key Components

- Identify strategies to address identity-based disparities
- Grow community capacity to partner / lead work
- Promote sustainable growth
- Support economic development
- Reduce involuntary displacement
- Improve access to opportunities education, employment, healthcare, services, recreation, transportation
- Establish evaluation indicators to monitor progress and impact
- Enhance community engagement/input in defining issues, desired outcomes, and ways to get there

Anticipated Outcomes

- Increased internal City capacity to integrate equity into decision-making
- Increased community participation and capacity
- Higher engagement in planning and decisionmaking
- Greater trust between community and local government
- Reduction in socio-economic disparities
- Reduction in involuntary displacement
- More equitable resource and opportunity distribution





A New Trajectory

Proactively respond to foundational shifts in Vancouver's economy

- Transition from a land rich bedroom community to a dense urban community
- Accommodate significant regional population and job growth
- Respond to emerging community priorities such as...
 - Mitigating the impacts of climate change
 - Addressing disparities to ensure widely-shared economic opportunity
 - o Creating affordable and accessible communities that maintain a high quality of life



A Roadmap for Economic Prosperity

Vancouver's Economic Development Strategy will

- Inform the Economic Chapter of the updated Comprehensive Plan
- Align with CREDC's update of the Clark County Comprehensive Economic **Development Plan**
- Define City roles & responsibilities within the regional blueprint to ensure alignment and seamless service delivery
- Prioritize programs and initiatives to support:
 - Small businesses, entrepreneurs, and innovation
 - Neighborhood commercial districts
 - Employment land and industrial development
 - Job creation and target industry growth



Roles and responsibilities

- Consultant team
 - ECOnorthwest
 - Lead strategy development
 - Communicate directly with staff
 - Research and analysis
 - Produce deliverables
 - WSP
 - Ensure Comp Plan consistency
 - Facilitate plan development

- City roles
 - City of Vancouver staff
 - Review and critique materials
 - Survey and communicate with stakeholders
 - Steering Committee (20+ Community Leaders)
 - Attend two advisory meetings focused on principles, vision, and goals
 - Core planning team (8-10 people)
 - Engage in **four** strategy sessions focused on priorities, strategies/initiatives, and success metrics
 - City of Vancouver staff + community partners



Economic Development Strategy Audience

 - Focus and clarify City priorities and EPH Dept. direction
 - Inform workplans
- Vancouver City Council
 - Provide governance and resourcing support
- Community Stakeholders




