Code Violation complaints

Please be courteous and kind to your fellow neighbors and abide by the laws! There have been several complaints of code violations in our Neighborhood, so here is a list of some codes.

Domestic Animals and Livestock – Municipal code 20.895.050 - Poultry & Rabbits. Turkeys, Roosters and Peacocks are **NOT** permitted.

Animal noise control – Municipal code 8.24.130

To report a barking dog, you need to have a recording of the barking for 10 minutes at one time or several shorter videos that add up to 30 minutes in a 24-hour period.

Animals-- Running at large – Municipal code 8.24.110 – Cats are allowed to roam, but dogs are **NOT** allowed except at off leash dog parks.

It is illegal to have bad odor on your property that affects the ability for your neighbors to use their outdoor property.

Annual Neighborhood Cleanup:

Saturday, July 13th, 2024 from 8am to 1:30pm

@ Marrion Elem. School Parking lot

These items are NOT ACCEPTED...

- NO Household trash or contractor waste
- NO Large or heavy quantities of concrete, cement, rocks, sod or dirt
- NO Home project/remodel debris (i.e. material from a remodel, large amounts of fencing, etc.)
- NO Roofing shingles
- NO Hazardous chemicals, paints or stains, fluids like gasoline or oil
- NO TV's, computers or electronics (recycle them through the Washington E-cycle program, www.ecyclewashington.org)
- NO REALLY LARGE items like boats or hot tubs, haul these directly to the transfer station.
- **NO STYROFOAM**

This will be Accepted at the cleanup...

- Bulky Items- Broken or worn-out items that are too large to fit in your garbage at home.
- Scrap Metal- (separate container) Metal BBQs, bicycles, lawn furniture, mowers, car parts or small engines (drained of fluids) metal appliances (no Freon containing items please)
- Yard Debris- (separate container) Branches, grass, leaves, vines, yard & garden trimmings
- **Chipper ONLY available 8am to 12pm**

Prepare Your Load:

- Categorize your load separate material for easy unloading into the donation/garage sale area (for items that are still useable.) Then there's the bulky item truck, yard debris truck, metals recycling box.
- Use a tarp liner under the yard debris for faster and cleaner unloading
- Don't forget to cover your load to prevent littering if you bring a truck or trailer
- Come prepared to unload what you bring to the cleanup (i.e. leather gloves and tools to unload)

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT THE CLEANUP

Volunteers are needed to direct traffic, monitor the different drop off places like TOO-GOOD-TO-TOSS, yard debris, chipper, scrap metal, garbage trucks and to organize food for the volunteers. It is a great way to get to know one another have a fun time with new neighbors.

TIPS FOR RECYCLING at the CURB

FLATTEN all paper and cardboard containers, so the recycling machine, which separates 2-D from 3-D, can recognizes it as paper and sorts it into the correct place. **SHREEDED PAPER** and **PAPER SMALLER THAN A STAMP CAN <u>NOT</u>** BE RECYCLED in your recycling cart, but there are other events that take it.

Leave lids on the weaker plastic containers, like water and soda bottles, and DO NOT CRUSH CANS or containers! The recycling machine sorts them with a 3-D sensor and if they are flat, they can get mixed in with paper products.

DO NOT PUT YOUR RECYCLING IN PLASTIC BAGS! – Production is forced to stop every 2 hours to cut the plastic bags loose that have clogged the machine, which wastes time. The more time wasted, the more we have to pay for services!
