Heights Bike Garden Opened June 8

Ready to Roll Into Summer?

Vancouver's first-ever bike garden is a miniature streetscape designed to help community members of all ages learn about cycling and pedestrian safety in a fun, interactive environment free from cars.

The Heights Bike Garden is a temporary recreation space available for community use until the Tower Mall site is redeveloped into a new mixed-use neighborhood with housing, shops and restaurants as part of Vancouver's Heights District plan.

The bike garden was designed by <u>First Forty Feet</u>, in collaboration with <u>Discover Traffic Gardens</u>.

Getting here

Limited free parking is available on-site. Parking is located on Blandford Drive off Mill Plain Boulevard.

C-TRAN's <u>The Vine Red Line</u> Devine Rd. stop also provides direct access to the garden.

Using the bike garden

All users must follow posted safety rules and requirements for use per <u>Vancouver Municipal Code 15.04.</u>

Before you go

- Ride safe: Helmets are required for all riders per <u>Vancouver</u> <u>Municipal Code 9.62.030</u>
- Plan for potty breaks: Two, temporary ADA portable restroom facilities are available on-site. Restrooms at neighboring businesses are reserved for customers only
- Stay cool: Bring a water bottle and sun protection (this former parking lot space offers limited shade and seating)
