City of Vancouver Garbage/Recycling Neighborhood Programs

The City of Vancouver's Solid Waste Services provides many resources to assist residents and neighborhood associations with garbage and recycling needs as a benefit at no additional cost.

Free Disposal for Yard Debris & Tires | Spring

Residents receive one set of coupons for free yard debris and tire disposal. Two coupons for yard debris (\$60 value) and one coupon for passenger tires (4 max), good from early April to end of June each year.





Free Leaf Disposal Coupons | Fall

Coupons are available for all residents for free fall leaf disposal, good from October through December each year.



Free Bulky Item Pickup | One time per year

Vancouver residents with active garbage service are eligible for one free curbside disposal of up to five bulky items, each item weighing less than 100 pounds. Annual Used Appliance Roundup | One time per year

Residents with active garbage service may schedule one free pick up of a major appliance, once per calendar year. Contact Waste Connections to schedule a pickup.

Neighborhood Cleanup | One event per year

All recognized and active City neighborhood associations are eligible for one cleanup event each year, held on a Saturday. The cleanup is intended to provide neighborhoods with the opportunity to dispose of bulky items, yard debris and scrap metal. Neighborhood associations are responsible for organizing volunteer staffing at the cleanup and publicizing the event to their neighborhood residents. Chipper | One time per year

Neighborhood associations can request City of Vancouver Public Works crews to come out for four hours on a Saturday to chip woody debris, including brush and limbs. Scheduling and availability depend on seasonal demand for this service.



RecycleU | Throughout the year

Residents can attend a Recycling 101/201, Organics 101 or Food Waste Prevention class and publish recycling articles in neighborhood newsletters or on NextDoor. Joint training is provided by City of Vancouver, Clark County Green Neighbors and Waste Connections. Attend trainings to earn bonus dollars for your neighborhood association.
