What's Accepted at a Neighborhood Cleanup?

- **Bulky Items:** Items too big for your garbage cart such as rug, kiddie pool, furniture, small appliances.
- **Scrap Metal:** Metal grills, lawn chairs, mowers, etc. **MUST** be drained of gas, oil, etc. **NO** refrigerators, freezers or AC units. (No Freon)

What's Not Accepted?

- **NO** Household trash or contractor waste
- **NO** Concrete, rocks, sod or dirt
- **NO** Home remodel debris, tiles, drywall, etc
- **NO** Roofing shingles or roofing materials
- **NO** Hazardous chemicals, cleaners, paint, stains or fluids such as gasoline, oil or antifreeze
- **NO** TV's, computers or electronics
- **NO** CFL or fluorescent light tubes
- **NO** very LARGE items such as boats or hot tubs
