 - a. Continued 2025 Health Plan Renewal Discussion None
 - b. Medical Insurance Opt Out
 - Discussion Leader: lasmina Giurgiev
 - Discussion: In 2024 the Governing Board voted to change the opt out amount to be 50% of the lowest cost plan that is not a High Deductible Plan (HDHP). The amount was approximately \$431. It was noted by lasmina that this amount will change every year due to the change in premiums every year. The OPEIU contracts do not allow for this to change every year, so lasmina proposed to keep the opt out amount the same for 2025.
 - <u>Action Taken:</u> Iasmina made a motion to keep it the same, Natasha seconded the motion, the motion passed unanimously.
 - c. Acupuncture, spinal manipulation, and massage visits
 - Discussion Leader: Erica Riggs
 - <u>Discussion:</u> The Governing Board had previously voted to change the alternative care on the Regence plan to 12 visit limit in order to match the Kaiser plan. Historical data was reviewed and it showed that the average number of visits for these services was less than 12 for a 12

month period. This discussion came up again because the Regence plan covers massage benefits as well as acupuncture and spinal manipulation under alternative benefits. Therefore, the board needed to vote to include massage in the 12 visit limit.

- <u>Action Taken:</u> Motion was made by Natasha to limit massage to the 12 visit limit, Shannon seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-1.
