Oct. minutes approved.

Treasurer Report- \$5750.80 in checking and \$2,113.34 in savings. Income was from sponsorships, 2 grants, the neighborhood clean-up, and \$100 from City of Vancouver Resource Conservation Challenge.

City of Vancouver: Question: The bus stop at F and Fourth Plain is being dug up, what is going on with the Ctran bus? Maggie will find out and let us know. We would like to send a thank you to the street sweepers today for cleaning our streets this week.

Port Of Vancouver: Moving a lot of grain on the river and Subarus. We were awarded \$22.5 million in the Clean Ports Program and will use it to buy 2 electric mobile harbor cranes.

IBR Presentation: Casey Lyles. We are in the environmental phase. Final EIS will be second half of next year, then permitting and real estate, design, preconstruction and start of the project. Design options being studied-Bridge configuration, with or without C street ramps to/from I-5, inclusion of one or two auxiliary lanes, possible park and rides at Waterfront and Evergreen Transit stations, and I-5 alignment: centered or shifted west between SR14 and Mill Plain Blvd. Tolling-bi-state tolling subcommittee was set up. They are meeting tomorrow. They do allow public comment. They will make the full recommendation for the tolls. Elevation coming off the Bridge-116 feet clearance over the water so about 140 ft. First light rail station is around 80 ft. high. What happens to Evergreen blvd? It needs to be a little higher but other than that it is the same. Light rail station is next to Evergreen blvd. It will be elevated over the freeway.

Arnada concerns: Impacts-The SEIS is not the final design. Want to avoid adverse impacts. Neighborhoods will still have input through the entire process. We don't have any of the details yet for the sound walls.

Arnada park staging area-the desire is not to impact the park. No plans to stage something in Arnada

Park. They are going to try to avoid it. If they end up needing it, there will be mitigation.

They want to start construction as soon as they can. 9-15+ years of construction. Bridge is 4-6 years and then it will go north and south from there. It all depends on funding.

Tolling-it will all be passcard and license plate readers.

ANA Response to the IBR EIS: ANA will submit the comments as preferences that are posted in the newsletter. Motion passed.

Request for ANA to donate \$100 for the Hough Winterfest. It gives low-income children an opportunity to purchase gifts for their family. Passed on vote.
