Being a recognized entity by the City of Vancouver gives us a voice and lets us advocate regarding issues within the city that impact our neighborhood.

Is VFLNA an HOA? - a note by Carl Trinacty, past President VFLNA

The Village at Fisher's Landing is one of seventy two recognized neighborhood associations within the City of Vancouver. Some may refer to us as an HOA (Home Owner's Association) and that we are **not**. To reiterate, we are not a Home Owner's Association.

As a neighborhood association (NA) we are a group of residents or property owners who advocate for and organize activities within the neighborhood. We are volunteers some of whom are elected to the board of directors who organize our activities along with members at large. Along the way since 1986 we have asked for voluntary contributions to assist with landscape management (regular cleanup and pressure washing as needed) along the 164th Street and 34th Way plus various activities that are of benefit to our residents. Though we have CC&Rs to maintain property value, our association relies on civic spirit, unlike many HOAs with mandatory dues, strict rules, and sometimes paid management. Little Free Library:

Bringing Books Closer to Home

This VFLNA initiative was launched in March this year. You may recall reading about it in the Winter and Summer newsletters. We're excited to announce that the VFLNA has received a \$500 Vancouver city grant to fund our neighborhood's very first Little Free Library! With our nearest public library over four miles away, this library will bring books—and the joy of reading—much closer for residents of all ages.

Thanks to the generosity of our neighbor, **Libby Clow**, who has offered a spot on her property, we also have a great location for the library on SE 34th way. The project will involve local youth groups, who will build the structure using an eco-friendly kit made of recycled composite lumber, which requires no painting.

Next step is for the property owner for the necessary permit to install the library on the parking strip. In addition to books, this Little Free Library will feature a weatherproof brochure holder stocked with VFLNA newsletters and useful City materials. We'll soon host **a book drive** to gather the initial collection for the library. To keep things running smoothly, the role of Library Steward will rotate among residents.
