Join Your Arnada Neighborhood Association Activities

In 2024, the Arnada Neighborhood Association spent approximately \$100 more than we earned. Our annual income covered 98% of our expenses. See details on the following page.

Expenses \$4730.18 ANA expenses included the following activities: Family Day in the Park, Painting the intersection of 22nd and D Streets, Band Concert in the park, Easter Egg Hunt, and Kickball, as well as Cleanup Day in cooperation with 3 other neighborhoods, and a donation to the Hough PTSA.

Income 4629.49 A total of \$3,139 came from local businesses sponsoring us by paying for publication in our newsletter insert. We also received \$1,020 in grants, \$288 from Cleanup Day, \$100 in the Resource Conservation Challenge, and \$82 in bank interest.
