Neighbors On Watch Academy

The next session of Neighbors on Watch (NOW) Academy is April 17 - May 22, 6 - 9:15pm, 6 weekly training sessions.

Community members in the City of Vancouver that are interested in making their neighborhoods safer are encouraged to apply for the Vancouver Police Department's volunteer program called "Neighbors On Watch". All volunteer applicants must successfully pass a screening process which includes criminal background investigation, fingerprints, interviews and reference check.

Positive relationships between the police, the community and individual community members are extremely important and are vital to the success of Community Oriented Policing. Consequently, community member volunteer programs are a n integral part of the community policing efforts of the Vancouver Police Department. An especially important aspect of suck efforts is the positive impact individual citizens can have on our community's crime problems and quality life issues.

How do you become a NOW volunteer? Some of the criteria are:

Be over 21-years of age, live in the city limits of Vancouver, have a valid driver's license and insurance, successfully pass a background investigation, attend a 28 hour training academy, commit to volunteer at least four hours per month, and be willing to coordinate with other volunteers to patrol city neighborhoods.

New(ish) Bike Garden

In October, we had a representative from the City come give us an update on the Heights District Development Plan and talk about the new Bike Garden. If you want to learn more about the HDD Plan, please go to the city website:

While the Heights District Plan is still aways off, the City has instigated a temporary space activation by adding a Bike Garden! The bike garden was designed by an urban design firm, First Forty Feet, with consultation from Discover Traffic Gardens. This is a fun and educational way to activate the almost two-block asphalt area before construction commences in 2025/2026.

Bike gardens, known to most as traffic gardens, are safe and engaging spaces where children and people of all ages can learn to ride bikes, learn the rules of the road, and pedestrian safety while being free from motor vehicles. The Heights Bike Garden is a scaled-down, model streetscape that is complete with roadways, intersections, roundabouts, stop and yield signs, and pedestrian crosswalks.

The art depicted on the mural structures and colors for the design come from the theme of the Grand Loop - Vancouver's natural elements which include volcanology, hydrology, ecology, and geology. The planning effort to provide a safe, comfortable, and inviting space with seating, portable toilets, trash cans, and dedicated parking was a joint effort between the redevelopment team, Parks department, and Public Works. Over a 3-day event in June of 2024, volunteers from the City of Vancouver, Bike Clark County, and community members picked up paint rollers and brushes to bring the vision alive

The Bike Garden Grand Opening was on June 8, 2024.

Survey Work Ahead

In December 2024, all neighbors would have received a postcard from the City detailing the upcoming survey work (you can see a picture of the postcard in our Facebook page).

The City is planning a water main replacement project in our neighborhood. Construction is anticipated in late 2025 or early 2026.

As they develop the water utility improvements, we might notice City employees in our neighborhood. These crews are surveying the area and gathering information to help with design plans. Workers will wear personal protective equipment, such as reflective vests, so they can be easily identified as survey work gets underway. General work hours will be 7 am to 6 pm, Monday through Friday.
