Guest Speaker at the April 30th Meeting

HomeShare works to find affordable housing in Clark County. They address housing insecurity by helping folks with a spare bedroom, list their space. They gain rental income, find support to upkeep their home and fight loneliness. They fundraise to pay for background checks and have volunteers to help navigate the web-platform. Housing insecurity is common for folks in low-wage or first-time jobs and especially among seniors on fixed incomes. *The Columbian* has reported extensively on this. ***Before another senior loses their home, we are taking action and need your help!***

SPEEDING on Northbound NE 97th Avenue:

NEW SPEED LIMIT SIGNS!

It was brought to my attention that there were **NO SPEED LIMIT SIGNS** for **northbound traffic** on NE 97th Ave. from Mill Plain Blvd. to NE 19th Street, which is a mile! That could be part of the problem. So, I left a message with Office of Neighborhoods on March 6th. On March 19th they installed the speed limit signs. I was impressed, ask and you shall receive! ***Thank You City of Vancouver!***

Domestic Animals and Livestock – Municipal code 20.895.050 - Poultry & Rabbits.
Turkeys, Roosters and Peacocks are NOT permitted.

****Due to the egg shortage, we understand more people wanting more chickens. Even though it is legal, it can still be a huge nuisance to your neighbors, so please be respectful and kind by keeping your yard free of noises, rats and bad odors, which are considered nuisances and can be punishable by law.**

Animal noise control – Municipal code 8.24.130

To report a barking dog, you need to have a recording of the barking for 10 minutes at one time or several shorter videos that add up to 30 minutes in 24-hour period.

It is illegal to have bad odors on your property that affects the ability of your neighbors to use their outdoor property.

Annual Neigh. Cleanup/Dump Your Junk Day - Early this year! ***Saturday, May 31st, 2025 @ 8am-1:30pm (chipper only 8am-12pm)*** ***@ Marrion Elem. School in the East Parking lot***

The City of Vancouver rewards neighborhoods that recycle and reuse at cleanup events.

We need to do 3 of the following to qualify for a reward.

- 1. Separate yard debris and bulky items*
- 2. Divert reusable items for a community garage sale/donate to local charity -Too-Good-To-Toss!*
- 3. Recycle lawn mowers & old Bicycles*
- 4. Collect scrap metal for recycling*

These Items are NOT ACCEPTED:

- *NO Household trash or contractor waste**
- *NO large or heavy quantities of CONCRETE, CEMENT, ROCKS, SOD, DIRT**
- *NO home project/remodel debris** (i.e. sheet rock, paint, fencing etc.)
- *NO Roofing shingles**
- *NO Hazardous chemicals** (paints, stains, automotive fluids)
- *NO T.V.'s, computers/electronics** (recycle through Washington E-cycle www.ecyclewashington.org)
- *NO extremely large items** (boats, hot tubs etc. Take these to the transfer station)

These Items ARE ACCEPTED:

- *Bulky items:** broken/worn out items too large to fit in your home garbage.
- *Scrap Metal:** metal BBQ's, bicycles, lawn furniture, **NON-FREON** metal appliances. mowers, car parts/small engines; **fluids must be drained**
- *Yard Debris:** Branches, grass, leaves, vines, bramble, yard/garden trimmings.

PREPARE YOUR LOAD:

- *Categorize your load –Separate material** for easy unloading into donation area for items still usable, yard debris, metals recycling box, bulky items.
- *Cover your load**
- *Come prepared to unload what you bring** (leather gloves/tools to unload)

****IMPORTANT, PLEASE READ****

Most people DO NOT have a truck to haul their large debris to the cleanup and many have had to rent trucks that costs \$80 or more. We have an opportunity to purchase a large trailer this year for \$1000. But, the MNA does not have that much disposable funds, so we need donations. We are hoping neighbors can donate now, so we can purchase it, then each cleanup, neighbors could donate maybe \$20 or what they can afford, for a volunteer to help them haul their large debris items to the cleanup.

Ones who donate now will not have to donate later and will have priority in dumping their debris.

Please let us know your thoughts & opinions on this matter, we will need the general membership to vote.
